For the third successive year the Redskins have compiled a brilliant, well respected record. The chief of coaches Doug Hamley, Howard Woods and "Zerk" Wilson finished the gridiron year with a 8-2-1 record. In the process they captured a tie for the District 6 title and placed third in the powerful Delta Valley Conference after a playoff loss to the Winona Tigers.

Coach Howard Woods' Yazoo Indians, to this point in the season, hold a 6-9 record and are preparing for the forthcoming District 6A-AA tournament.

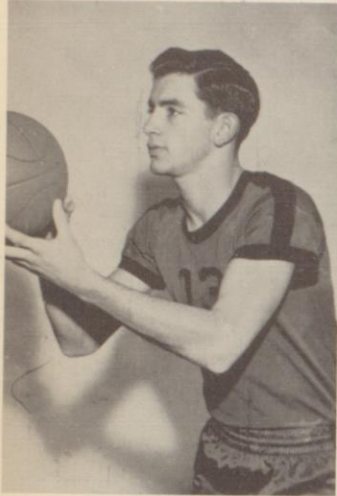

Regional, South Mississippi, and State competition are slated beyond our deadline; therefore results are not obtainable.

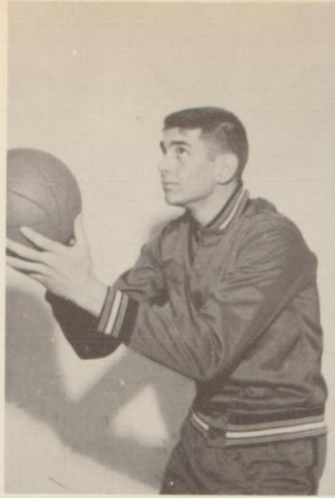

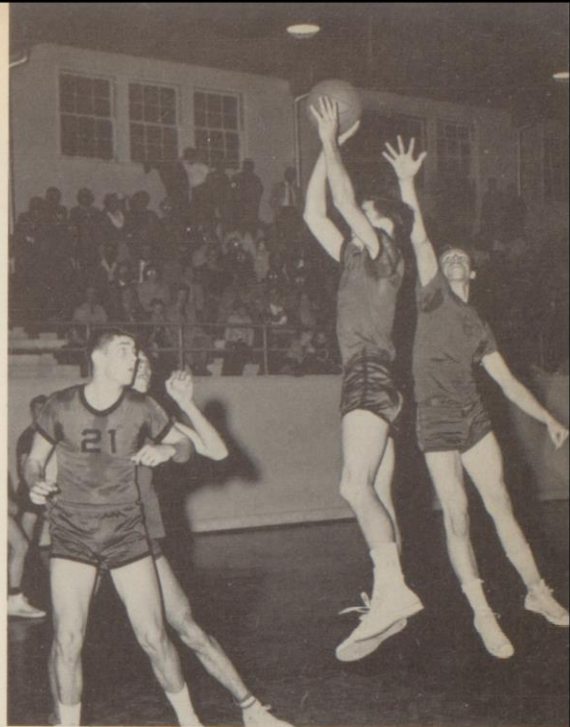

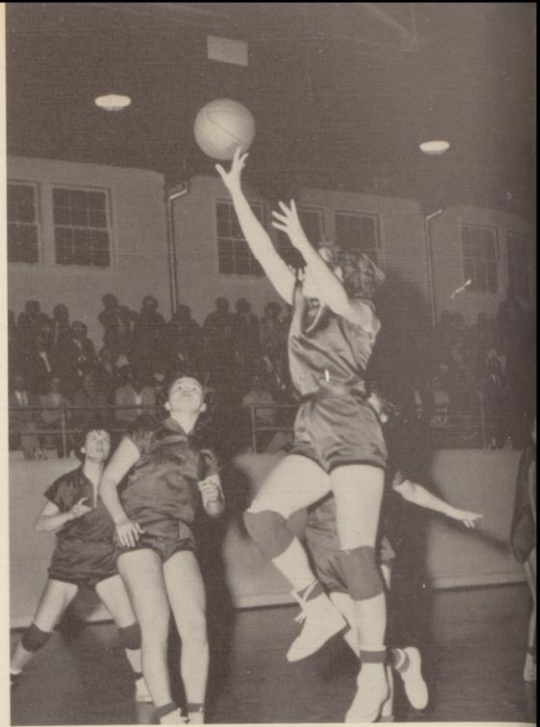

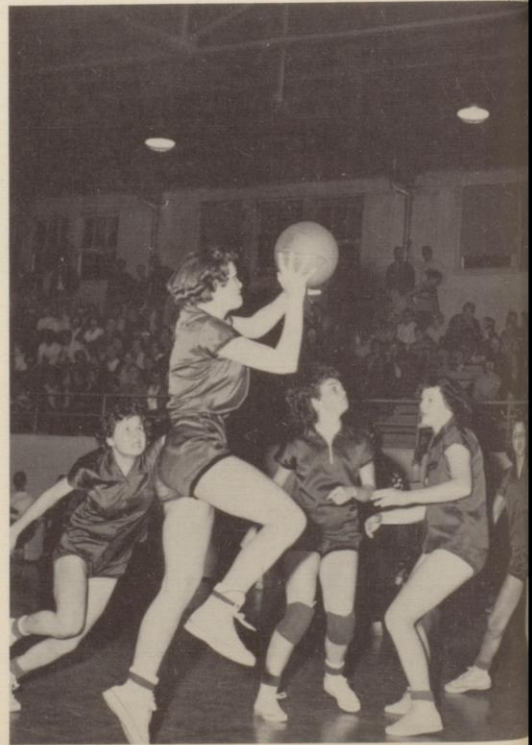
