Superintendent's Message



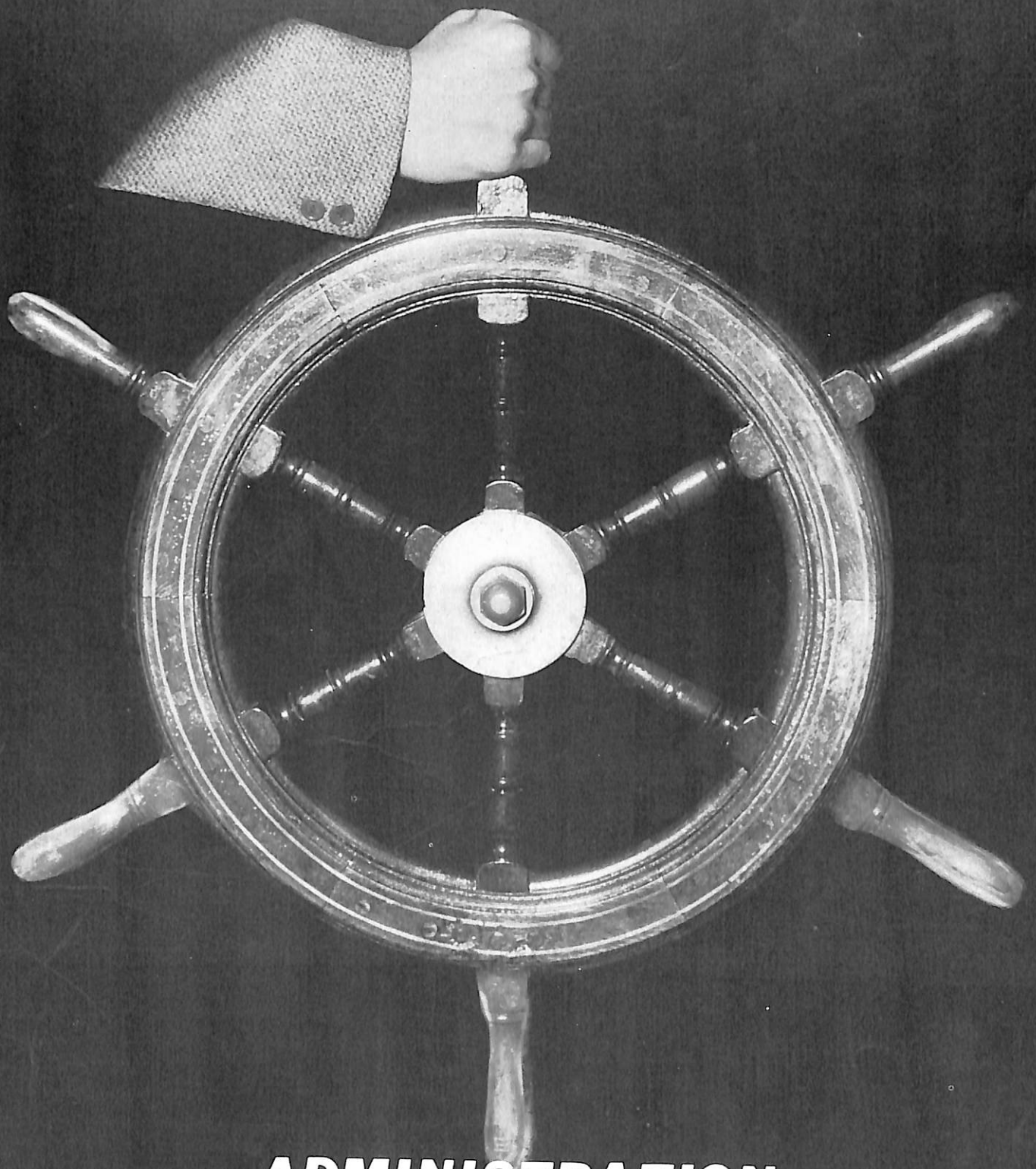
Congratulations to the Senior Class, and to the Staff and Advisors of the 1956 ZOOKEY.
